Word from MMH Hope Board Chair

A year ago in January of 2005 I had the privilege of visiting Congo with our MMH Hope Executive Director, Pakisa Tshimika. This was my second visit to Congo, and again I was struck with the resilience of the people in the face of overwhelming challenges. Hope is not dead in Congo, and certainly not now. With a high percentage of Congolese endorsing the new constitution of Congo this last month of December, 2005, and the first free election since the 1960s to be scheduled in 2006, hope is high. But I also know that hope in Congo has often teetered on the edge of disaster. With uncertainty we can exercise two options: We can sit back and wait and see, or we can risk involving ourselves and investing in making the future happen. As I see it, this is a moment of opportunity for Congo. This is not a moment to be quiet and do nothing. It is a moment to come alongside our Congolese brothers and sisters who have not only kept hope alive, but who are also actively working for a better future for their families, their churches and their society.
